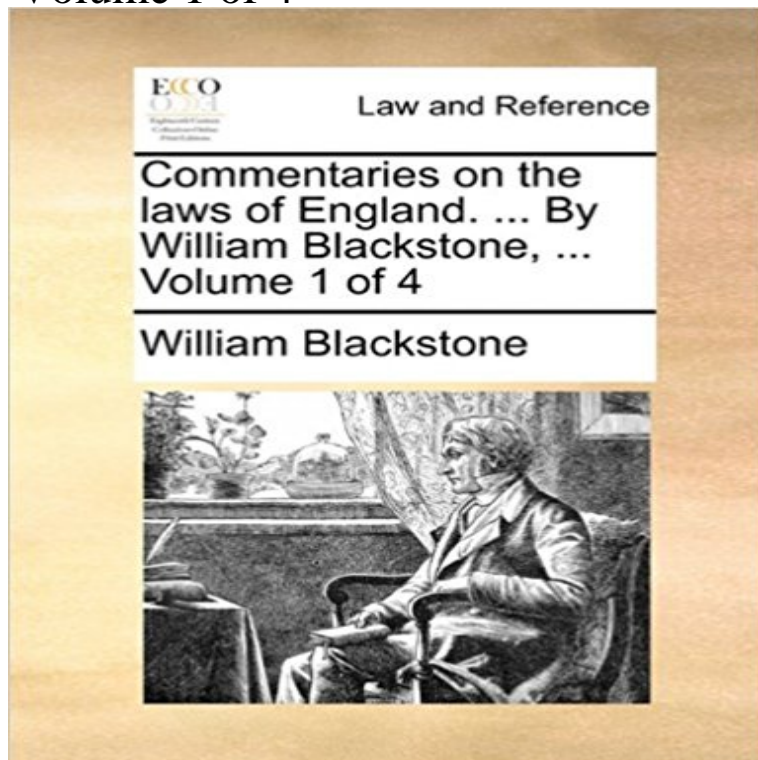

"Those looking for more flexibility over the shorter term may prefer a discounted deal, but those looking for some security could choose the fixed rate. "In such a low interest rate environment it would be ideal for borrowers to
